

Hand Photography

Introduction:

Our hands are the way we interact with the world. Hands are one of the greatest tools we have and are often taken for granted. At the same time, they can create very interesting compositions when posed and lighted adequately.

Rationale:

For this lesson students build on their developing knowledge of taking, composing and editing pictures as aligned with the district curriculum map for digital photography. Previous to this lesson we have covered composition in photography (how to create a well-balanced photograph), how to set-up and use artificial lighting, and how to work within a photography group to take pictures. In this lesson we will expand on creating well composed photographs, of hands, and building on their knowledge of editing photographs in Photoshop via levels adjustment and layer overlays.

Objective:

1. Students will **create** a series of photographs of hands as the subject.
2. Students will **demonstrate** knowledge of setting up lights for a photo shoot.
3. Students will **apply** textures to images as part of the editing process in Photoshop.
4. Students will **upload/share** images via google drive.
