For my final project I chose to photograph nature. More specifically I chose macros of flowers. The first picture I took is of a red and yellow flower. To make the picture pop more I increased the clarity and contrast. Then I went into the background of the picture with the burn tool, to make it black. The black next to the red and yellow really makes the flower standout. Also the flower isn't centered in the middle of the picture, which gives it more visual interest. The second picture I took was of a group of light pink flowers. The flowers are arranged in a way that they create a frame around the picture, and help your eyes move around the picture. While editing I kept the original light color of the pink flowers because it looked good up against the green background color. The only thing I changed about it was I increased the darkness of the background to make the pink pop. The third picture I took was the inside of a pink striped tulip. The original color of the flower was really light, so I increased the vibrancy of all of the colors. The pink and green work well together. The fourth picture I took was of a light pink flower with a bright pink middle shooting outward. The only thing I did to this picture was I cropped some of the edges, and increased the vibrancy of the colors. The fifth picture is of three little blue flowers, with a dark pond as the background. These flowers are actually very small so I got really close up to them, to see more detail and make them seem bigger. I like how the green in the background kind of frames out the picture and how the background is dark compared to the light blue flowers. I increased the contrast and vibrancy. Also I increased the clarity so that the flowers looked sharper. The other two pictures in the folder are just random and I like them.
